Timbers Update

We would like to update you on the use of timbers from the old Granite Island Causeway.

Following the decommissioning of the old Granite Island Causeway, sections were retained at each end and reconstructed as viewing platforms. These were opened to the public in late 2022. Some of the timber from the decommissioned causeway for future use on jetties was also stored.

Timber has been provided to Alexandrina Council to be used in the reconstruction of the heritage-listed Currency Creek Bridge and to the City of Victor Harbor for use on local community projects, such as fencing for the Horse Tram Authority.

Due to the level of contamination the remaining timber removed from the old Causeway will not be distributed to individuals.

The State Government has foregone a portion of its own allocation and set it aside for local community projects.

We have recently met with local community groups and will be providing them with a small amount of decontaminated timber for projects that will provide an opportunity to enjoy the timber in appropriate outdoor community settings, while paying homage to the history of the Causeway.
