

Lower North East Road, Campbelltown Pedestrian Actuated Crossing

Commencement of works

We are making it safer and more convenient for pedestrians and cyclists to cross Lower North East Road, Campbelltown

This project is funded by the \$168 million Road Safety Program, jointly funded by the Australian (50%) and South Australian (50%) governments.

What's happening

We are installing a new Pedestrian Actuated (push button) Crossing on Lower North East Road in Campbelltown, outside the ARC Campbelltown recreation centre, between Atkell Avenue and Trafford Road.

This project will include:

- Installing a new Pedestrian Actuated Crossing with traffic signals (removal of old pedestrian refuge)
- new line marking to facilitate safe crossings for pedestrians and cyclists
- audible push buttons
- resurfacing of the pavement.

Works will predominately be undertaken during the day, commencing from Tuesday 14 July 2026, between the hours of 7am and 5pm.

Night works will take place from Friday 21 August 2026 to Friday 28 August 2026, weather permitting.

How this affects you

To safely undertake these works, speed and lane restrictions will be in place during work hours. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow directional signage.

Speed restrictions will remain in place outside of working hours, until completion.

Pedestrians and cyclists, please be cautious when passing through the area. Some areas may have restricted access, with traffic controllers and on-site signage to guide you to alternative routes.

Access to properties and businesses will be maintained. Advance notice will be provided if temporary access restrictions are required.

Thank you for your patience while these important works are undertaken.

Pedestrian Actuated Crossing (PAC)

This crossing will be a two-stage crossing to help pedestrians cross the road safely and keep traffic moving smoothly. Pedestrians press the button to activate the first walk signal and cross to the central refuge, then activate the next walk signal and complete the second half of the crossing.

The PAC will be equipped with an audible sound designed to assist pedestrians, particularly those who are vision impaired, in locating and using the crossing. The sound produced by these devices adjusts according to the background noise at the crossing location. To maintain safety, the volume is set slightly above ambient noise levels, ensuring it remains clearly audible to those using the crossing while minimising disruption to nearby properties.

PACs are installed in accordance with the relevant Australian Standards and meet the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA) compliance standards.

It is always safest to cross at a PAC if there is one available. By law, you must cross at a crossing if there is one within 20 metres. Drivers must not park within 20 metres of the approach to a pedestrian crossing or within 10 metres after passing it.
