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1. Introduction

School Context Statement

Saint George College is the first Greek Orthodox Bilingual College in South Australia. It was established in 1983 and operated for the first time in 1984. As an independent, co-educational, Christian school the College provides education from Playgroup to Year 12. The college operates under the auspices of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of Australia and overall responsibility for the College rests with the Greek Orthodox Community and Parish of St George Thebarton and Western Suburbs Inc in Adelaide, South Australia. The commencement of St George College was one of the most significant achievements in the history of the South Australian Greek Community. Over 685 students from Playgroup to Year 12 attend St George College. There is a strong contingent of ESL students from Korea, Africa, Afghanistan and Serbia giving the school a truly international flavour. Teachers at St George College are challenged with adapting their teaching methods to cater to all students, including ESL and Special Education.



Of the 108 younger student responses, 54.60% would like to ride or walk to school more.



Preferred travel methods




Is there a bicycle at home you can use?

Currently 1% of students cycle to school. However, 67.40% of students have a bicycle at home



2.3 Survey summary: Parent/Carer Trip to school or combined journey





Barriers for children walking or cycling





What would encourage more children to walk and cycle to and from school? (select up to three)


