

Is your team ready to respond in an emergency?

Measures to have in place should include:
Preparedness, Prevention, Response and Recovery

Potential emergency situations can include (but not limited to):

- Medical Emergency
- Fire
- Energy Source – Live Services
- Structural Collapse
- Unauthorised Entry/Threat to Workers
- Vehicular/Plant incident
- Suspended worker (work at height)
- Chemical/ Hydrocarbon spill.



Consider the following:

- **Emergency Response Team (ERT):** The ERT provide incident site control, communication support and co-ordinate external emergency services (particularly if site is remote or difficult to get to).
- **Emergency Equipment:** Ensure correct equipment is available and that inspection of equipment has been undertaken.
- **Emergency Response (Communications):** Ensure all workers know and understand the emergency response procedures, including the site evacuation and communication protocols (e.g., UHF etc.).
- **Emergency Response Training:** Ensure workers must understand their specific duties and roles during an emergency.
