## South Road, Mile End Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated Crossing

### **Commencement of works**

# We are making it safer and more convenient for pedestrians and cyclists to cross South Road

The \$168 million Road Safety Program is jointly funded by the Australian (50%) and South Australian (50%) governments over three years.

## What's happening

We are installing a new Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated Crossing (push button) on South Road at the intersection of Roebuck Street and King Street, Mile End.

Works will include:

- Installation of a new traffic signals
- Upgrades to the footpath and centre median, improving access and safety for pedestrians and cyclists
- Upgrades to existing street lighting
- New line marking and road signage
- Relocation of bus stop 4A, South Road, West Side

This will improve pedestrian safety and access to nearby retail shops, businesses and homes, while improving bicycle and pedestrian connectivity across South Road.

## How this affects you

#### South Road will remain open to traffic at all times.

To do this work safely, speed and lane restrictions will be in place throughout the work area. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers and follow the speed limits and signs. Outside of work hours, speed and lane restrictions will remain in place.

To minimise traffic impacts regular night works will be required.

In early October 2024, for approximately one-week South Road, between Daringa Street and Gladstone Road, will be restricted to a single lane during night work hours. Traffic controllers will be in place to control the direction of traffic. Speed restrictions will also be in place. During this time there will be additional local access detours in place, and South Road will not be accessible via Cuming Street. Please follow onsite signage and the directions of traffic controllers. Please see detour map below for more information.

Access to and from South Road via Roebuck Street and King Street will be intermittently closed, with local detours in place. Additional local access detours will be in place intermittently until all works are complete.

Access to properties and businesses will be maintained. Advance notice will be provided if temporary access restrictions are required.


There may be some noise from time to time, but we'll do our best to keep the disruption to a minimum.
