



Rundle Street Movement Study

Project Update

Creating a safer, more accessible and inclusive Rundle Street for people walking, riding, catching public transport and driving

Rundle Street, from Dequetteville Terrace to Fullarton Road, in Kent Town is a busy mixed-use corridor and creative precinct that supports significant walking, cycling, driving, parking and public transport activity.

Its mix of homes, businesses, intersections and frequent driveways make it a complex space to move through. We have undertaken a comprehensive study to explore how people currently move through the area, and to investigate and develop options for improvement to address existing issues and accommodate future planned growth.

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) met with Rundle Street Community Inc., who raised concerns about road safety, difficulty crossing the street, high traffic speeds and volumes, footpath and lighting condition, and pressure on parking. The community expressed a strong interest in making the street safer and more inviting, particularly for people walking and riding. To better understand how the street currently functions, the Department has collected movement data.

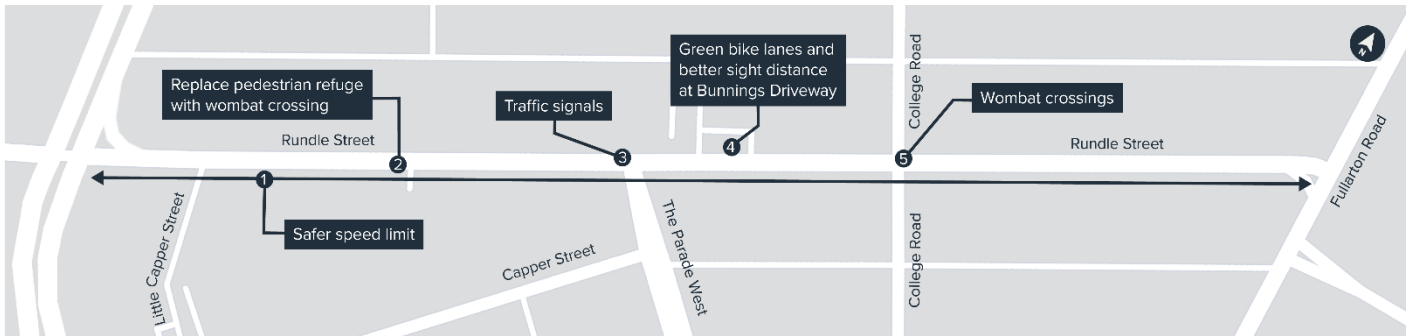

From these insights, we have developed a range of interventions for improvement to make Rundle Street safer, more accessible, and easier for people to move along—whether walking, riding, catching public transport, or driving.

We are now seeking feedback on the range of proposed interventions (including safer pedestrian crossings and intersections, improved active transport infrastructure, improved driveway safety and more accessible local connections) we have developed. We also want to hear about any other issues you may experience when travelling through the area.
