Tender process begins for \$55m Gawler East Link Road

Tenders will be called tomorrow to design and construct the 5.5 kilometre Gawler East Link Road to connect Main North Road with residential developments in the eastern part of the town.

The \$55 million project will support approximately 110 construction jobs during construction, with major works expected to start early next year.

It will also include new traffic signals and an upgrade of the Main North Road intersection with Potts and Para roads, as well as an upgrade to Potts Road, and a bridge over the South Para River.

The road will cater to new residential developments underway in Gawler East, Gawler South, and Evanston Park, which are expected to create 3500 new dwellings housing an extra 8400 residents.

The Gawler East Link Road will also provide an alternate route for existing residents in Gawler East to access Main North Road, helping to reduce vehicle traffic through the Gawler town centre.

Developers, including Springwood Communities, and the Town of Gawler are expected to contribute more than \$8 million to the cost of the new road, which will stimulate investment in these residential developments, in turn boosting the local economy and creating jobs.

Major construction is expected to commence early 2018 and be completed in 2019, weather permitting.

Background

The Gawler East Link Road will be a local road with one lane in each direction, including bicycle lanes and new footpath.
