Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

Works Notice

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is currently delivering infrastructure upgrades on the Princes Highway Corridor, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border. The project forms part of the \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade program, which is jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments (80:20).

These works will support South Australia's regional economic growth, improve access for high productivity freight movements, provide upgrades to regional road networks for improved accessibility and community connectivity, enhance opportunities for regional tourism in South Australia and improve long term safety and efficiency for all road users.

Upgrade works on the Princes Highway, from Tantanoola to the South Australian/Victorian border, are underway with works on two new overtaking lanes (one in each direction) between Mount Gambier and the Victorian border commencing shortly.

Project timing

Early works, including service relocations, will continue for approximately four weeks, weather permitting. Main construction is expected to commence in early October 2023. Works on these overtaking lanes are expected to be complete in December 2024, weather permitting.

Works will be undertaken Monday to Friday, between 6:30am and 5:30pm and Saturday, 6:30am to 1pm. Some work outside of these times may be required with advance notice provided. No works will be undertaken on Sunday.

What to expect

To safely undertake these works, speed and lane restrictions will be in place during the works. Please plan ahead, allow extra travel time, and take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area. Outside of working hours speed restrictions will remain in place subject to onsite conditions.

Access for emergency service vehicles and public transport will be maintained at all times during the works. Access to properties will be maintained throughout the works wherever possible, with advance notice provided if there is a need to temporarily restrict driveway access.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible.

The Department appreciates your cooperation and patience while these important works are undertaken.
