

Kings Road BPAC and Shared Use Path, Salisbury Downs

Project update

We are improving safety and connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists on Kings Road in Salisbury Downs

We are delivering a new Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated (push button) Crossing (BPAC) on Kings Road and a new Shared Use Path between Kings Road and York Terrace, adjacent to the Gawler railway corridor in Salisbury Downs.

What's happening

Works on the new Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated (push button) Crossing on Kings Road are continuing.

From Monday 19 January 2026 until early February 2026, night works will be undertaken in addition to ongoing day works.

All works are expected to be complete late March 2026, weather permitting.

How this affects you

To keep everyone safe, speed and lane restrictions will be in place during work hours. Please follow traffic management directions while works are in progress.

Speed restrictions will remain in place outside of working hours, until completion.

Access to the Parafield Railway Station carpark will be maintained throughout the project. Train services in the area will be maintained, however, please check the latest updates on scheduled services at adelaidemetro.com.au

Access for Thomas More College will be maintained.
