
Gawler Rail Electrification Project

As part of the Gawler Rail Electrification Project, the Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) advises that night works will continue within the rail corridor in the Dry Creek area.

Location: Between Port Wakefield Road and the Mawson Lakes interchange (refer to map).

When: From Monday 28 October, for approximately three weeks, within the rail corridor (weather permitting).

Work hours: Between 7pm and 7am, Monday to Friday.



What you can expect:

- A hydro-vacuum machine to identify underground services within the rail corridor.
- The work site will move progressively along the rail corridor, spending approximately 1 − 2 nights in each location.
- An additional truck with equipment accompanied by 1-2 light vehicles.
- Lighting towers, positioned to minimise disruption to neighbours.
- Project personnel working within the rail corridor.

These works are part of an increasing program of works in the area, occurring intermittently over the coming months, to prepare for the electrification construction works.

Work crews will make every effort to minimise the disturbance to residents and businesses.
