NOTICE OF DETERMINATION - REQUEST FOR ACCESS TO DOCUMENTS UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* ('the Act') which was received by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport on 30 June 2020.

You have requested access to the following:

"Copies of any and all documents (including but not limited to hard copy or electronic briefings, minutes, reports, emails, letters and any other correspondence) either to or from (directly or indirectly) officials, employees or contractors to DPTI and Minister Knoll his office regarding bus services, timetables, routes and bus stops within the State Electorate of Light, which includes the suburbs of Buchfelde, Evanston, Evanston Gardens, Evanston Park, Evanston South, Gawler, Gawler East, Gawler South, Gawler West, Hewett, Hillier, Kudla, Munno Para, Munno Para Downs, Munno Para West, Reid, Willaston. Date range 01-01-2019 to 29-06-20."

On 10 July 2020 your application was re-scoped to the following:

"Bus services in the suburbs located within the Electorate of Light – and how they were considered in the recent proposed network changes.

Date range 1/01/2019 – 30/06/2020."

On 15 July 2020 we issued a notice advising the due date had been extended by 62 days to 30 September 2020.

The 30 day period for processing your application has now passed. A determination was due on 30 September 2020. This means that the department is deemed by section 19(2)(b) of the Act to have refused access to the documents requested.

However, the department has continued to process your application outside this timeframe.

There are 21 documents which have been located that are within the scope of your request. I have determined to release one document in full. I have determined to partially release two documents, and refuse 18 documents in accordance with section 20(1)(a) and (b); and Clauses 7(1)(c) and 9(1) of Schedule 1 of the Act which states:

20—Refusal of access

- (1) An agency may refuse access to a document—
- (a) if it is an exempt document; or
- (b) if it is a document that is available for inspection at that or some other agency (whether as part of a public register or otherwise) in accordance with Part 2, or in accordance with a legislative instrument other than this Act, whether or not inspection of the document is subject to a fee or charge; or........

7—Documents affecting business affairs

- (1) A document is an exempt document—
 - (c) if it contains matter—
 - (i) consisting of information (other than trade secrets or information referred to in paragraph (b)) concerning the business, professional, commercial or financial affairs of any agency or any other person; and
 - (ii) the disclosure of which-
 - (A) could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and
 - (B) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

9—Internal working documents

- (1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter—
 - (a) that relates to-
 - (i) any opinion, advice or recommendation that has been obtained, prepared or recorded, or
 - (ii) any consultation or deliberation that has taken place,

in the course of, or for the purpose of, the decision-making functions of the Government, a Minister or an agency; and

(b) the disclosure of which would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

Please note some redacted sections within the documents have been removed as they are out of scope.

Clause 7(1)(c)

Documents 1 and 16-19 contain information concerning the business affairs of third parties the disclosure of which could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs.

In considering the grounds for exemption of information under Clause 7, I have considered the public interest in disclosure or non-disclosure:

Factors in favour of release

- to enhance the scrutiny of government decision making;
- further the objects of the Act; and
- promote accountability of the agency and its staff.

Factors against release

- to ensure the effective conduct of government functions;
- allow for the free and frank discussion of ideas;
- disclosure would release information otherwise not publicly available;
- · would affect the free flow of information to government; and
- third party objection to release.

Upon weighing these factors I have determined, on balance, that it is contrary to the public interest to release the information.

Clause 9(1)

Documents 1 and 5 are emails and documents that contain opinions and advice prepared by the agency for the purpose of the decision-making functions of the department. The relevant information within these documents is considered exempt under clause 9(1)(a)(i) Schedule 1 of the Act.

Documents 2-4, 6-10, 12-15, 20 and 21 contains matter relating to opinions and advice prepared in the course of the decision-making functions of the department and the Minister. These documents are considered exempt under clause 9(1)(a)(i) Schedule 1 of the Act.

In considering the grounds for exemption of information under clause 9, I have considered the public interest in disclosure or non-disclosure:

Factors in favour of release

- further the objects of the Act;
- promote openness and accountability of the agency and its staff; and
- ensure administrative decisions are made on evidence;

Factors against release

- enable the free and frank discussion of opinions and advice;
- encourage the free exchange of ideas during deliberative process, including through the frank and candid assessment of information;
- ensure the effective conduct of government functions;
- draft documents are not complete works and do not contain, or have had applied, critical reviews and comments; and
- release of draft documents has a high probability of incorrectly projecting a conclusion which may not be a true and final conclusion of the department.

Upon weighing these factors I have determined, on balance, that it is contrary to the public interest to release the information.

Attached is an explanation of the provisions of the Act which details your rights to review this determination, and the process to be followed.

In accordance with 'Premier and Cabinet Circular PC045', if you are given access to documents as a result of this FOI application then details of your application, and the documents to which access is given, may be published in the agency's disclosure log within 90 days from the date of this determination. Any private information will be removed. If you have any objection to this publication, please contact us within 30 days of receiving this determination. FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991 YOUR RIGHTS TO REVIEW

INTERNAL REVIEW

If you are dissatisfied or concerned with the decision of this Agency regarding access to documents or the request for amendment to your personal records, you can apply for an Internal Review of that decision.

To apply for an Internal Review you must write a letter addressed to the Principal Officer or lodge an Internal Review application form with the Principal Officer of this Agency. The legislated application fee must accompany all applications, unless the fee was waived in the original Freedom of Information application, in which case there would be no fee payable for the application. The application must be lodged within 30 days after being notified of the decision.

The Agency will undertake the Internal Review and advise you of its decision within 14 days of receipt of the application.

Where the decision was made by the Minister or Principal Officer of the Agency, you are unable to request an Internal Review but you can apply for an External Review by the Ombudsman, or SACAT.

You are unable to apply for an Internal Review regarding a decision to extend the time limit for dealing with an application but you can apply for an External Review.

EXTERNAL REVIEW BY THE OMBUDSMAN

If the Agency does not deal with your Internal Review application within 14 calendar days (or you remain unhappy with the outcome of the Internal Review) you are entitled to an External Review by the Ombudsman SA.

You may also request an External Review by the Ombudsman if you have no right to an Internal Review.

The application for review by the Ombudsman should be lodged within 30 days after the date of a determination. The Ombudsman's Office, at their discretion, may extend this time limit.

Investigations by the Ombudsman are free. Further information is available from the Office of the Ombudsman by telephone on 8226 8699 or toll free 1800 182 150 (within SA).

REVIEW BY THE SOUTH AUSTRALIAN CIVIL AND ADMINISTRATIVE TRIBUNAL (SACAT)

If you are still dissatisfied with the decision made by this Agency after an Internal Review or after a review by the Ombudsman, you can request a review from SACAT.

You must exercise your right of review to SACAT within 30 calendar days after being advised of the determination or the results of any other Internal or Ombudsman Review. Any costs will be determined by SACAT, where applicable. For more information, contact;
