

## **Inquiry into Campbelltown City Council Boundary Change Proposal now underway**

The South Australian Local Government Boundaries Commission has begun an Inquiry into proposed changes to the Campbelltown City Council and Adelaide Hills Council boundaries.

The Campbelltown City Council has submitted a proposal to the Commission to expand its council boundaries to take in an area currently within the Adelaide Hills Council.

Following an open tender and thorough evaluation process, the Commission has provided a cost estimate to the Campbelltown City Council. The Campbelltown City Council will pay for the Inquiry and has agreed that the Inquiry should proceed. The Inquiry is expected to cost \$160,000 subject to any further work required as identified by the Commission.

BDO Australia has been appointed as the Investigator for the proposal and will begin work in mid-2024 to provide a report to the Commission to enable it to make recommendations to the Minister for Local Government on whether the proposed council boundary changes, or any other changes, should proceed.

This work will include the development and delivery of an Engagement Plan that will ensure that local communities, affected councils, landowners and all parties with an interest in the future of this growing area can be well-informed as the Inquiry proceeds, and make their views known on any potential change.

The Commission, an independent body, must consider all proposals for changes to council boundaries.
