

Lincoln Highway and McBryde Terrace intersection, Whyalla

Intersection upgrade works notice

We are making it safer and more convenient to use the intersection of Lincoln Highway and McBryde Terrace, Whyalla

The \$168 million Road Safety Program is jointly funded by the Australian (50%) and South Australian (50%) Governments over three years.

What's happening

To improve safety and reliability we are upgrading the intersection of the Lincoln Highway and McBryde Terrace, Whyalla. See concept below.

The upgraded intersection will include:

- a new Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated Crossing (push button crossing) at each corner
- realignment of pathways to the new crossing
- improved median islands to accommodate pedestrians
- improved road lighting and traffic signals
- new road surface and line marking on all approaches
- new landscaping with irrigation.

What you need to know

To help keep everyone safe, speed and lane restrictions will be in place, including outside of work hours as required. At times the Lincoln Highway and McBryde Terrace will be closed with local detours required and onsite signage and traffic controllers in place to guide traffic through the area.

Access for heavy vehicles along the Lincoln Highway freight route will be maintained at all times with traffic controllers guiding heavy vehicles through the work area.

Minor delays are to be expected, please plan your trips, observe signage and follow the direction of onsite traffic controllers.

Access to surrounding properties will be maintained however there will at times be temporary restrictions to some property's driveways while road resurfacing works take place. Advance notice will be provided to residents. There will be some impacts to on-street parking during construction.

Temporary pedestrian and bicycle detours will be in place, with onsite signage guiding you to alternate routes.

Minor noise disturbances are expected during works, but we will minimise any disruption to residents as much as possible.

Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated Crossing (BPAC)

Currently the intersection has push button crossing points for cyclists only and only on some of the approaches. Work will soon start on upgrading this intersection to include a Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated (push button) Crossing (BPAC) on all approaches. This will improve bicycle and pedestrian safety and access to nearby sporting facilities, parks and homes, while improving connectivity across Lincoln Highway and McBryde Terrace.

The BPAC will be equipped with an audible warning sound designed to assist pedestrians, particularly those who are vision impaired, in locating and using the crossing.

The sound produced by these devices adjusts according to the background noise at the crossing location. To maintain safety, the volume is set slightly above ambient noise levels, ensuring it remains clearly audible to those using the crossing while minimising disruption to nearby properties.

BPACs are installed in accordance with the relevant Australian Standards and meet the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (DDA) compliance standards.
