

Gorge Road Safety Upgrade

Work notice

We are delivering critical road safety upgrades to Gorge Road to improve road safety and network reliability

The State Government has allocated \$10 million over four years to undertake regional road safety treatments. This forms part of the State Government's \$98 million road safety package in partnership with the Commonwealth Government.

What's happening

We are undertaking safety upgrades along Gorge Road between Amber Gully and Corkscrew Road, Montacute. Works will include installation of safety barriers, road resurfacing and line marking.

These upgrades will improve road safety for all users and support sustainable regional growth.

How this affects you

Early works, including vegetation management, will be undertaken in late July 2026. Major works to install safety barriers, as well as road resurfacing and line marking, will commence from early August 2026 with completion expected in September 2026, weather permitting.

Gorge Road will remain open at all times.

To safely undertake these works, speed and lane restrictions will be in place along Gorge Road between Amber Gully and Corkscrew Road, Montacute. Please plan your trips, follow the directions of traffic controllers, and observe temporary signage when travelling through the area.
