Granite Island Causeway Project

The South Australian Government has committed \$31.1 million in funding towards the Granite Island Causeway Project to be delivered by The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI).

The Causeway is the only link between Granite Island and the mainland at Victor Harbor and is an area of cultural significance to the Traditional Owners of the area.

The Granite Island Causeway is an iconic landmark with considerable heritage value.

The Causeway is also a popular tourist attraction, important to the local, regional and state economies.



A feasibility study into the potential upgrade options for the State Heritage listed Causeway structure has been undertaken.

It has been determined that retention of the existing structure is not possible and options were considered to maintain connectivity between Victor Harbor and Granite Island.

A new Granite Island Causeway will be realigned and constructed next to the existing Causeway, with flexibility for future development.

The new Causeway will consider transport, accessibility and recreation options.

It will provide a community connection, which will continue to deliver and enhance social, environmental and economic benefits to the region.

This project will deliver a long-term solution that is environmentally sensitive.

Works have been undertaken on the existing structure to maintain safety and accessibility until the new Causeway is constructed.

The project is expected to commence in late 2020 and is anticipated to be open for public access in late 2021. All works (including decommissioning of the existing Causeway) are expected to be complete in late 2022, weather permitting.
