Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

Overtaking Lanes, Meningie

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is delivering infrastructure upgrades on the Princes Highway Corridor by constructing two new overtaking lanes between Meningie and Salt Creek in the upper south east of the State. Overtaking lanes improve road safety by providing and encouraging safe overtaking opportunities for all road users.

This project forms part of the \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade program, which is jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments (80:20).

What to expect

Works are continuing on the northbound and southbound overtaking lanes located approximately 12 km south of Meningie. Due to inclement weather, some emergency remediation works within the project work area on the Princes Highway are required.

These works are being undertaken Monday to Friday between 6:30am and 5:30pm and on Saturdays between 6:30am and 1:00pm.

To undertake these works safely, traffic will be reduced to a single lane with temporary traffic signals in place to control the direction of traffic. Speed restrictions will also be in place throughout the work area. Please see map overleaf for details.

Temporary traffic signals will remain in place at all times, including outside work hours, until mid-October 2023, weather permitting. Once traffic can be reinstated to one lane in each direction, speed restrictions will continue to be required for the remainder of overtaking lane project.

The project is expected to be complete in February 2024, weather permitting.
