

# East Terrace, Strathalbyn Koala Crossing

## Works update

**We are delivering critical road safety upgrades and improvements on remote, regional, urban roads, footpaths and cycle paths around South Australia.**

The \$168 million Road Safety Program is jointly funded by the Australian (50%) and South Australian (50%) Governments over three years.

## What's happening

We are installing a new Koala Crossing on East Terrace, near Chapel Street in Strathalbyn to improve safety and access, particularly to the local schools. Koala Crossings have white road markings, red and white posts with two yellow alternating flashing lights on top, which indicate when the Koala Crossing is operational.

Further site investigations on East Terrace are required, to help us better understand existing site conditions prior to major works commencing later this year. The project will also include the extension of the existing school zones, which will be continuous from Gollan Avenue to Rowe Street.

## How this affects you

There will be no changes to traffic conditions. However, pedestrians and cyclists may have limited access. Please be cautious when passing through work zones, follow onsite signage while works are in progress.
