Dear Michael,

I am writing to advise that at the SA Planning Reform Program Steering Committee ("Committee") met on Wednesday 24 February 2021, and resolved to recommend to the State Planning Commission that the draft Phase Three Planning and Design Code be endorsed.

The Committee has received an attestation of the worthiness of the code for endorsement by the responsible parties for Policy, Mapping and Overall Program delivery oversight function as set out in its Terms of Reference with all due diligence.

In making this recommendation the Committee notes that -

- All required procedural steps have been taken to ensure that the Code has the policy provisions approved by the State Planning Commission.
- All changes to the code are traceable and appropriately authorised.
- The completeness of the code has been verified. No fundamental elements of the code are missing or omitted that would impact the policy settings within the code.
- Each of the components of the code are correctly integrated (maps, words, tables, linkages); and
- The accuracy of the code has been tested, validated, and confirmed.

It is noted that it is entirely possible and expected that there will be some minor refinements required to the code over coming weeks and months. However these are not of a policy nature nor do they go to the material technical correctness of the code but will be of a transactional nature.

We trust this assurance in support of the Committee's recommendation to be acceptable. Should you require, we will be pleased to attend a State Planning Commission meeting to provide further information and advice on this matter.
