Portrush and Magill Roads Intersection Upgrade

Safety Improvements to Thornbury Street

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is upgrading the intersection of Portrush and Magill Roads to improve travel times, connectivity, capacity and safety for all users. The \$98 million project is jointly funded (50:50) by the South Australian and Australian Governments.

As part of the Portrush Road and Magill Road intersection upgrade, the left turn access from Portrush Road into Thornbury Street will be banned. This access change is required to reduce the likelihood of crashes arising from Portrush Road south bound traffic merging from three lanes into two lanes, adjacent the intersection with Thornbury Street.

What to expect

The Department will be installing a concrete traffic island at the entrance to Thornbury Street, off Portrush Road, which will include additional line marking and new signage. Please note there will be no change made to the current left turn access from Thornbury Street onto Portrush Road.

These works are scheduled to occur in late 2021, weather permitting. Further notification will be provided as works progress on site.
