Beachport Jetty and Southend Jetty Upgrades

Works Notice

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is undertaking works on the Beachport Jetty and Southend Jetty. These essential works will ensure the long-term structural integrity of both jetties for all users. Works on the heritage listed Beachport Jetty and Southend Jetty are funded by the South Australian Government.

Southend Jetty

Works include repairs to four lower landings and removal and replacement of two others, after they all sustained damage from several large swell events in 2021.

The repairs to the four landings are expected to be completed in time for the upcoming fishing season which starts in September 2022, weather permitting. Access to the Southend Jetty will be temporarily closed whilst works are being undertaken.

Full project completion is expected in early 2023.

Beachport Jetty

Upgrade works will include:

- refurbishment of timber piles, framework, and steel cross bracing;
- installation of new safety ladders;
- replacement of decking; and
- repairs to the landings, handrails and fenders (jetty protective buffers).

Works on the Beachport Jetty are scheduled to commence in early September 2022 and will generally be undertaken Monday to Sunday between 7am and 5pm, weather permitting.

The work will typically occur on and near the jetty landings, ramp and towards the sea end of the jetty.

To safely facilitate these works, the sea end of Beachport Jetty will be closed to the public. The shore end will be closed intermittently as required with advance notice signage in place to advise jetty users.

Short term full jetty closures will also be required at the beginning and at the end of each working day to enable materials and equipment to be safely moved onto and off the jetty. To safely facilitate these activities short term speed restrictions will be in place on Beach Road in the vicinity of the jetty.

Pedestrian access to the sections of the jetty not under construction will be maintained.

Access for boats to moor under the jetty will be limited to designated sections not currently under construction.

Access to residential and business properties, as well as the Beachport foreshore, will be maintained at all times. Please continue to support local business.

Pedestrians and cyclists travelling along Beach Road are advised to take care. For safety reasons there may be some restricted access. Where required, signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access and/or detours. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to the community.

The Department will work closely with the community, the fishing industry and Council to accommodate and minimise impacts to local community events and activities as much as possible during this important project.

This project is expected to be completed in the third quarter of 2023, weather permitting.
