Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

Tantanoola Works Update

We are upgrading the Princes Highway Corridor, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border, to improve long term safety and efficiency for all road users. The \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor program is jointly funded by the Australian (80%) and South Australian (20%) governments.

What's happening:

Finishing works are nearing completion with final sealing, line marking, hydroseeding, installation of signage, guideposts and pedestrian fencing continuing to complete the overtaking lane extensions and newly upgraded rest area.

When

Works are continuing until late April 2024 weather permitting

Hours of operation

Monday – Friday 6:30am – 5:30pm

Saturdays 6:30am – 1pm

Where

Princes Highway at the existing westbound rest area at Tantanoola.

How this affects you:

To safely facilitate these works, traffic will continue to be reduced to a single lane on Princes Highway with traffic controllers on site to help manage the one-way flow of traffic while these works are undertaken. Outside of work hours, all lane restrictions will be removed, and traffic will be reopened to two-way traffic.

Speed restrictions will be required at all times until line marking is fully complete and roadside furniture such as shelters, benches and pedestrian fences has been installed. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow the speed limits and signs.

No works will be undertaken over the Easter Long Weekend with traffic open to two-way traffic under speed restrictions.
