

Freight Highway Upgrade Program

Augusta Highway and Stuart Highway Works Notice

We are delivering upgrades to improve the safety and reliability of national freight routes across the state. The \$500 million program is funded by the Australian (80%) and South Australian (20%) governments over 10 years.

What's happening:

We are undertaking pavement rehabilitation works and road widening on the Stuart Highway and Augusta Highway at multiple locations between Yorkeys Crossing Road and Northern Power Station Road.

How this affects you:

Works on the Stuart Highway between Yorkeys Crossing Road and Richardson Crescent will be undertaken during the day. Works on the Augusta Highway between Ritma Road and Northern Power Station Road will also be undertaken during the day.

To reduce impacts to road users, works on the Augusta Highway between Carlton Parade and Edinburgh Terrace **will be undertaken at night for the duration of the project.**

Works will move progressively around the various locations.

To do these works safely, the Augusta Highway and Stuart Highway will be reduced to a single lane under speed restrictions at the location where works are occurring.

While works are underway, traffic controllers will be in place to help manage the flow of traffic. Please follow traffic management directions while works are in progress.

Outside of working hours, the Augusta Highway and Stuart Highway will be fully reopened with speed restrictions remaining in place as required, subject to onsite conditions.

Some properties will have some short-term restricted access. Affected property owners, residents and businesses will be contacted directly prior to the works. Traffic controllers will be on site to assist with access. There may be some noise and dust from time to time, but we'll do our best to keep the disruption to a minimum. You might also notice some odours, which is normal during asphalt work.

Speed restrictions will remain in place until line marking is fully complete which is expected in mid-2024.
