

# Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

## The Springs Road/Burrungule Road Intersection Upgrade

We are upgrading the Princes Highway Corridor, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border, to improve long term safety and efficiency for all road users. The \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor program is jointly funded by the Australian (80%) and South Australian (20%) governments.

### What's happening:

We are undertaking pavement works at the Princes Highway intersection with The Springs Road and Burrungule Road to improve road quality and safety at this intersection.

### How this affects you:

To keep everyone safe there will be changes to traffic conditions for the duration of works.

To minimise impacts to road users and the community, works will be completed on one half of the intersection at a time.

Access between Princes Highway and The Springs Road will be temporarily closed (including outside of working hours) **from Monday, 22 July 2024 for approximately 3 weeks, weather permitting.**

Following completion of this stage of work, access between the Princes Highway and Burrungule Road will be closed for approximately 2 weeks while remaining works are completed.

Relevant detours will be in place for the duration of closures. Please see map overleaf for more details.

**Princes Highway will remain open at all times with traffic reduced to a single lane intermittently during working hours.** Onsite traffic controllers will be in place to help manage the flow of traffic.

Outside of working hours, lane restrictions on the Princes Highway traffic will be removed, with speed restrictions in place subject to onsite conditions. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow the speed limits and signs.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however we will minimise disturbance, as much as practically possible. You might also notice some odours when travelling through the area, which is normal during asphalt works.

Following completion of pavement works, speed restrictions will remain in place until line marking, and finishing works are completed.

All works at this location are expected to be completed in late October 2024, weather permitting.
