### Purpose

This Fact Sheet provides information regarding Agency Participation in the Future Across Government Facilities Management Arrangements (AGFMA).

### The AGFMA

The AGFMA is the mechanism by which the South Australian Government uses to ensure that facilities around the state are properly maintained, so that they remain safe and fit for purpose for the delivery of the essential community services they support.

### In-Scope Agencies

In accordance with the July 2021 Cabinet Submission that approved awarding the Future AGFMA contract to Ventia (which built upon the June 2020 Cabinet Submission that approved the development of the Future AGFMA), the provision of facilities management services under the Future AGFMA is mandated for all State government-funded Agencies that own or operate building facilities. This includes the Agencies that currently receive facilities management services under the existing AGFMA, as listed in **Table 1**.

Should State government-funded Agencies<sup>1</sup> not listed in **Table 1** own or operate building facilities, those Agencies are required to advise the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) AGFMA Team (refer to contact details below) so that maintenance services occur under the AGFMA.

AGFMA In-Scope Agencies are referred to as Participating Agencies within the AGFMA.

The Chief Executive (or equivalent) of each Participating Agency is required to execute a Memorandum of Administrative Arrangement (MoAA) with the DIT Chief Executive. This document defines the respective roles, responsibilities and interfaces between Participating Agencies, DIT as the central agency responsible for the AGFMA, and Ventia as the government appointed Facilities Management Service Provider.

For Agencies which have a predominantly volunteer based workforce, DIT will work with these Agencies to ensure that an optimal scope of services outcome is reached for Government. This will include a signed agreement that will be endorsed by the Chief Executive of DIT.

### Process to seek exemption from the Future AGFMA

In accordance with the July 2021 Cabinet Submission, Participating Agencies who wish to seek exemption from the Future AGFMA will only be able to do so if they:

1. Prepare a business case justifying their proposed exemption;
2. Seek endorsement from the Chief Executives of DIT and Department of Treasury and Finance; and
3. Make a submission to Cabinet to secure approval for an exemption.
