

Immunisation Requirements for all AGFMA workers attending Emergency Services Sector Facilities.

This is an Administrator's Instruction for **all workers** attending Emergency Services Sector (ESS) facilities and settings delivering services under the Across Government Facilities Management Arrangements (AGFMA).

A person must not engage in work or perform duties in any ESS settings from **17 December 2021** unless:


- a) the person has received at least one dose of a Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) approved or recognised COVID-19 vaccine by 10 December 2021; and
- b) the person has received, or has evidence of a booking to receive, a second dose of a TGA approved or recognised COVID-19 vaccine within the interval after the first dose recommended by the ATAGI for that COVID-19 vaccine; or
- c) the person has completed a course (being 1 dose or 2 doses in accordance with the schedule recommended by ATAGI) of a Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) approved or recognised COVID-19 vaccine.

The direction includes the following specified facilities and settings:

- a) the new Emergency Services Headquarters Building located at 37 Richmond Road, Keswick;
- b) SACFS Regional Headquarters facilities located in Mount Barker, Roseworthy, Murray Bridge, Port Augusta, Naracoorte and Port Lincoln;
- c) SASES Regional Headquarters and Direct Officer facilities at Netley including SSU and State Warehouse, Port Pirie, Port Lincoln, Loxton, Murray Bridge and Mount Gambier;
- d) SASES Temporary Crew Accommodation and Basecamp facilities; and
- e) SAFECOM State Emergency Information Call Centre capability facilities.

It is important to verify and confirm requirements prior to attendance and confirm these aspects at the site. These **may** include but are not limited to:

- displaying proof as detailed above.
- specific PPE including but not limited to personally fitted N95 masks or training.
- having personal details and attendance recorded on an approved contact tracing system (COVID Safe Check in QR app or written record).
- minimising time and interactions on site and following local site or agency specific instructions.
- keep up to date with changes to requirements to avoid service delivery impacts, delays or being refused site entry.



The COVID-19 situation is ever-changing, and government strongly encourages vaccination and recommends this requirement be considered as part of wider risk assessments and duty of care approaches for other/all sites.
