

Tram Grade Separation Projects

South Road Tram Overpass

Early works

As part of the \$15.4 billion North-South Corridor, River Torrens to Darlington Project a rebuild of the tram overpass at South Road is required to facilitate the construction of the T2D motorway.

This upgrade will be delivered as part of the Tram Grade Separation Projects, which also includes the level crossing removals at Marion Road and Cross Road, Plympton.

We are ready to start our early works program which will assist us with finalising the design development. Survey and ground investigations will commence in early June and be undertaken across various locations until late August 2024.

Further information about the re-build and construction staging will be available once our construction Alliance partner has been selected and we are able to work through the detailed construction program.

Please be assured we are working collaboratively with the River Torrens to Darlington Project Team to keep you up to date with activities in your area.

What's happening:

Investigations will move progressively around the area and occur at multiple locations including South Road and local side roads near the overpass. Some investigations will also be required in pedestrian areas under the overpass, and within the rail corridor.

Investigations will primarily be undertaken during the day and occur at each location for a short period of time. We will let you know in advance if nights works are required in your area or if works are required for longer periods of time in a certain area. To minimise impacts to traffic, works on South Road will typically be undertaken at night.

When

Monday 3 June to late August 2024 weather permitting

Typical hours of operation

Day works
Monday to Saturday
7am – 5pm

Night works
Sunday to Friday
7pm – 6am

Where

South Road, Glandore near the overpass and local side roads including:

- Nottingham Crescent, Glandore
- Glengyle Terrace, Glandore
- Aroha Terrace, Black Forest.

As well as the pedestrian areas both on and below the overpass, including the Mike Turtur Bikeway.

How this affects you

During these works there will be changes to traffic conditions to keep everyone safe. Speed and lane restrictions will be in place while works are underway. Please follow traffic management directions and onsite signage. Outside of working hours, traffic will be reopened with all speed and lane restrictions removed wherever possible.

Access to properties will be maintained during the works. We will provide advance local notification for residents and businesses if access to your property is to be temporarily impacted.

During these works there may be some noise disruptions from time to time. We will do our best to minimise noise wherever possible.

Pedestrians and cyclists should take care when travelling through the area. For safety reasons, there may be some restricted access. Signage will be in place to direct you to alternative access and/or detours.

There will be no impacts to bus or tram stops or services as part of these works.

We appreciate your cooperation and patience while these important works are undertaken.
