

Tram Network Improvements Stop 2 Wayville

Pedestrian Crossings and Footpath Upgrade Works

The South Australian Government is undertaking upgrades of the tram line between South Terrace and Mosley Square. These upgrades will improve passenger safety and comfort.

What's happening

We are carrying out additional upgrades along the tram line while it is closed to facilitate the removal of three level crossings, as part of the Tram Grade Separation Projects.

As part of these works, we are making Tram Stop 2 Wayville safer and more accessible for everyone. Upgrades include improving the pedestrian crossings at Stop 2 and between Joslin Street and Rogers Street, as well as sealing the footpath alongside the tram line between Joslin Street and Stop 2.

While the majority of the works will occur during the day, some night works may be required to minimise disruption. Nearby properties will be notified in advance of any night works.

What to expect

From Monday 27 October 2025 to January 2026:

- a work compound will be set up at the end of Bendall Avenue near the tram line
- the pedestrian crossings at Stop 2 and between Joslin Street and Rogers Street will be temporarily closed. Pedestrians and cyclists should use alternative crossing points at Le Hunte Street or Tram Stop 3 Goodwood Road
- temporary traffic management and parking restrictions will be in place on Rogers Street around our work zone during daylight hours
- one lane of the Mike Turtur Bikeway from Rogers Street to just past Bendall Avenue will be temporarily closed to support the work zone set up
- vegetation pruning and removal will be carried out in the surrounding areas; and
- the footpath between Joslin Street and Stop 2 will be temporarily closed.
