

Old Murray Bridge Refurbishment Project

Temporary bridge closure

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is undertaking major refurbishment works on the Old Murray Bridge.

As the first major bridge spanning the Murray River in South Australia, Old Murray Bridge is a significant State Heritage structure and requires major refurbishment to maintain its long-term structural integrity. This South Australian Government funded project will increase the bridge's life span by an estimated 30 years.

As previously advised, temporary bridge closures will be required to enable works to be undertaken safely and efficiently. Every effort is being made to minimise the number of closures required.

Further to the previous notification, the advertised full bridge closures for 5 to 7 September have been rescheduled and will now occur between 7pm and 6am on the following nights, weather permitting:

- **Wednesday, 6 September 2023;**
- **Thursday, 7 September 2023; and**
- **Friday, 8 September 2023.**

During these temporary scheduled bridge closures, detours will be via the Swanport Bridge. Please see the '*Detour routes for temporary bridge closures*' map included in this notice.

Advance notice of future temporary bridge closures will be provided via on site messaging boards, project updates and social media closer to this time.

Outside of bridge closure times, the single lane arrangement will continue for the duration of the project. Speed restrictions will remain in place on the approaches to the bridge, with temporary traffic lights in place to control the direction of the traffic at each end of the bridge.

Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to take care when travelling through the area. On-bridge access will be maintained for pedestrians and cyclists throughout the project, including during periods of temporary closure. Signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists on the bridge.

For safety reasons, the existing temporary restrictions to pedestrian and cyclist access underneath the bridge will continue for the duration of the project. Signage is in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access and/or detours.

Access to local businesses and residences in the area will be maintained at all times. Please continue to support the local businesses.

To receive advance notification of future temporary bridge closures and project updates please register via any of the options at the end of this notice.

Link SA services will be affected during the temporary bridge closures and some delays may be experienced during the works period. For further information regarding any changes to bus stops, routes and timetables please see signage on bus stops or visit www.linksa.com.au

Delays are expected so please plan ahead, allow extra travel time and take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Access for emergency services vehicles will be maintained at all times during these works. During periods of temporary bridge closures, access for emergency services vehicles will be managed by the on-site traffic controller as required.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the works will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses, as much as practically possible.

Environmental controls will be implemented to ensure there is no impact to the Murray River.

The project is expected to be completed in early 2024, weather permitting.
