

Princes Highway Upgrade

Works Update

We are delivering infrastructure upgrades on the Princes Highway, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border. These upgrades are jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments (80:20).

What's happening

Remediation works are recommencing on the Princes Highway at:

- the Hatherleigh overtaking lanes (north and southbound) approximately nine kilometres north of Millicent
- the overtaking lane extensions (west and eastbound) approximately 13kms southeast of Millicent
- the overtaking lane extension (westbound) approximately 15kms northwest of Mount Gambier
- the overtaking lane extension (eastbound) approximately 9kms northwest of Mount Gambier.

Rectification works are also required on the overtaking lanes approximately 12kms south of Meningie (north and southbound) and the overtaking lanes (east and westbound) between Mount Gambier and the South Australia / Victoria border.

Landscaping and minor enhancement works on the recently upgraded Suttontown Road, Wehl Street North, O'Leary Road and Penola Road roundabouts in Mount Gambier will be carried out February to March 2025.

How this affects you

Princes Highway

The Princes Highway will remain open to all vehicles at all times.

To keep everyone safe and ensure these works can be completed as quickly as possible there will be changes to traffic conditions throughout the work areas while works are in progress.

During work hours the Princes Highway will be reduced to a single lane where works are being undertaken (works will move progressively around the work sites). Traffic signage and traffic controllers will be in place to guide motorists through work areas.

Speed restrictions will be in place throughout work areas, including outside of working hours where required, until all works are completed in March 2025.

Mount Gambier

There will be changes to traffic conditions to keep everyone safe. **Access along Jubilee Highway West through the roundabout for eastbound and westbound traffic will remain open under speed and lane restrictions.** Speed restrictions will remain in place until all works are completed.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however we will minimise disturbance as much as practically possible.

We appreciate that works along the Princes Highway have been ongoing for an extended period of time and apologise for any inconvenience caused. We would like to thank you for your patience and understanding while these critical upgrade works are undertaken.

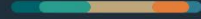
