

Kings Road BPAC and Shared Use Path, Salisbury Downs

Project update

We are improving safety and connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists on Kings Road in Salisbury Downs

We are delivering a new Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated (push button) Crossing (BPAC) on Kings Road and a new Shared Use Path between Kings Road and York Terrace, adjacent to the Gawler railway corridor in Salisbury Downs.

What's happening

Construction of the new Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated (push button) Crossing on Kings Road will commence from Friday 31 October 2025 and is expected to be complete in late March 2026.

Works on the new BPAC will include:

- new Bicycle and Pedestrian Actuated (push button) Crossing with pedestrian ramps and connections to existing paths
- new traffic signals, including overhead signals and CCTV
- new stop line marking to prevent queuing over the level crossing

As part of the BPAC works, the existing crossing (approximately 160 metres west of the railway crossing) will be decommissioned once the new BPAC is operational.

How this affects you

To keep everyone safe, speed and lane restrictions will be in place during work hours. Please follow traffic management directions while works are in progress.

Speed restrictions will remain in place outside of working hours, until completion.

Some nightworks will be required with advance notice provided to nearby residents before these works take place.

Sunday to Thursday between the hours of 7pm and 6am, as required.
