Works notice – Pedestrian refuge

We're making it safer for pedestrians to cross Majors Road, O'Halloran Hill

What's happening

We are installing a pedestrian refuge crossing on Majors Road outside IQRA College. The pedestrian refuge will provide a pedestrian connection to the Shared Use Path on the southern side of Majors Road and improve access and safety for students.

Works will take place from Monday 4 May 2026 for approximately four weeks. Work will be carried out between 7am and 7pm Monday to Friday.

How this affects you

Majors Road will remain open during the works with speed and lane restrictions in place as required. **Access to IQRA College will be maintained at all times.**

Please take extra care when workers are on site and observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area. Speed restrictions will remain in place outside of working hours.

There will be temporary access changes to the Shared Use Path in and around our work areas. Short-term detours may be required at times to safely facilitate works. Clear signage will be in place during these times to direct pedestrians.

There may be noise during construction as we undertake certain activities and some temporary pedestrian and cyclist access changes, we will do our best to minimise impacts where possible.

A new 40 km/h time-based speed limit will be introduced near IQRA College to improve children's safety and support safer travel to and from school. The 40 km/h speed limit will come into effect once the pedestrian refuge is complete and the static speed sign is installed.
