

Main Street, Crafers – Wombat Crossing

Works notice

We are making it safer for pedestrians to cross Main Street in Crafers

We are delivering critical road safety upgrades and improvements on remote, regional and urban roads, footpaths and cycling paths around South Australia.

This \$168 million program is jointly funded (50:50) by the Australian and South Australian governments over three years.

What's happening

We are installing a new Wombat Crossing on Main Street, between Cox Place and Picadilly Road, Crafers.

Works will include:

- installation of a new raised safety platform
- new and upgraded street lighting and signage
- new kerbing and footpath connections
- drainage works.

Wombat crossings encourage motorists to slow down, increasing awareness of their surroundings improving safety for all road users. A concept design for the Wombat Crossing on Main Street, Crafers can be viewed overleaf.

The electrical switchboard at the corner of Main Street and Picadilly Road will also be replaced with a new one.

In addition, a new 40 km/h speed limit will be introduced between Mount Lofty Summit Road and Piccadilly Road to improve safety in this pedestrian precinct. The lower speed limit supports the installation of the raised pedestrian (wombat) crossing to reduce the likelihood and severity of crashes between vehicles crash and pedestrians at the crossing.

How this affects you

To keep everyone safe, speed and lane restrictions will be in place during work hours. Outside of work hours, speed restriction will remain in place until all works are completed.

Access to businesses and properties will be maintained at all times. Advance notice will be provided if temporary access restrictions are required.

For the Wombat Crossing to safely function the existing on-street car park area will be reconfigured to provide one parking space. Please refer to the [Raised Wombat Crossing Factsheet](#) for further information.

Vegetation management, including some removals, within the vicinity of the crossing will be undertaken ahead of construction.

There may be some noise during construction as we undertake certain activities, but we will do our best to minimise impacts where possible.
