Main South Road Duplication Project Current proposal

The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly committed \$453 million in funding for Main South Road Duplication Project between Seaford and Sellicks Beach, to be delivered by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport.

The Main South Road Duplication Project aims to improve road safety for all road users as well as improve traffic flow and increase capacity on this section of Main South Road.

The duplication will assist tourism growth in the southern region by making Kangaroo Island, the Fleurieu Peninsula and its wine regions, walking trails, restaurants and southern beaches more accessible, providing for more economic development opportunities. The duplication will make travelling to, from and within Adelaide's southern region safer and easier.

The project has been defined in two stages. Stage 1 includes duplication from south of Griffiths Drive in Seaford to Aldinga; approximately 10 kilometres in length. This will also include the replacement of the bridge over Pedler Creek at Seaford Rise. Main South Road Duplication Stage 2 extends from Aldinga to Sellicks Beach; approximately 6 kilometres in length.

A concept design has been developed for Stage 1, following initial community consultation to identify issues and opportunities along this section of Main South Road.

The Department is seeking further feedback from the community on proposed scenarios to inform best outcomes for delivery of this project, in conjunction with the Victor Harbor Road Duplication Project. Direct engagement with the community will be a strong focus through the ongoing design development and delivery for this project.

The project is planned to commence in late 2021, with dual lanes open to traffic in 2023.
