

Ethelton Railway Station

Night works

The South Australian Government has committed \$9.9 million to upgrade the Ethelton Railway Station. The upgrade will include new platforms that will be more accessible, improving passenger safety and experience.

What's happening:

The works will be within the rail corridor and are required to maintain the track by compacting the ballast stones under the railway lines through a process called 'tamping'.

The works will be undertaken on **Tuesday 17 and Wednesday 18 September 2024** after last train service and before first train service.

How this affects you:

While tamping can be noisy and dusty, it is required to ensure durability of the track. You may experience low-level vibration and hear noise from rail equipment, machinery, vehicle movements and essential communication between workers, however every effort will be made to minimise disruption to residents during these works.

As the crews move along the railway line, medium to high levels of noise can be expected when the tamping machinery is in close proximity to your property.

Temporary lighting towers will be used at night along the works area to ensure safe working conditions for the team, we will ensure the lights are directed towards the work area.
