Main North Road and Nottage Terrace Intersection Upgrade

Service Relocation Works Notification

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) will be upgrading the intersection of Main North Road and Nottage Terrace to improve travel times, connectivity, capacity and safety for all users. The \$19 million project is jointly funded (50:50) by the South Australian and Australian governments.

As part of the project, the Department advises that early works will be undertaken along Main North Road and Nottage Terrace to facilitate the intersection upgrade. These works will be undertaken in stages.

Timing of works:

Service relocations works are expected to commence Sunday, 13 September, with completion expected by the end of 2020, weather permitting. While the majority of these works are being undertaken during the day, night works are required.

Night works

In order to minimise the impact to road users and ensure works can be completed safely and efficiently, night works involving trenching for service utilities as part of the intersection upgrade will also commence on Sunday, 13 September 2020, and continue for approximately two weeks, weather permitting.

These night works will be undertaken by Telstra between 7pm and 6am each night from Sunday to Friday (no works will be undertaken on Saturday nights).

Day works

The remaining service relocation works (including remaining Telstra works) will be undertaken during the day, Monday to Friday, between 7am and 5pm, with the potential for some weekend works. Additional night works may be required, between 7pm and 6am, in order to minimise traffic impacts and to ensure the works can be completed safely and efficiently. Advance notice will be provided as works progress.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disruption as much as practically possible.

Major construction on the intersection upgrade is expected to commence early 2021, with project completion expected in late 2021.

Upcoming activities:

The works being undertaken by Telstra, commencing from Sunday, 13 September, include trenching works and the installation of two new manholes (access pits) within the existing footpath on the western side of Main North Road. The kerb-side lane in the vicinity of the works will be temporarily closed to allow for construction vehicles, including excavators, tippers and light vehicles.













Relocation of existing NBN infrastructure is expected to commence on Monday, 21 September 2020. Initial works, undertaken during the day, will be within the existing footpath on the northern side of Wilson Street. Excavators and light vehicles will be used for the works.

Other works will include Optus, TPG and Vocus telecommunication infrastructure relocation, APA Gas asset alterations, relocation of SA Power Networks 11kV underground infrastructure and SA Water asset alterations.

Some vegetation along the project corridor will be required to be removed to facilitate these works.

Prior to any removals, the work area will be inspected by a suitably qualified flora and fauna specialist and where required, fauna will be relocated to a similar habitat. Impacts will be minimised, as much as practically possible.

Additional site investigation works:

Additional site investigation works are also continuing Monday to Friday during the day, between 7am and 5pm. These works include the drilling of soil boreholes, and installation and monitoring of groundwater wells across the site. Workers will be on site during these times over a number of weeks in order to complete these works.

What to expect:

Speed and lane restrictions will be in place in the vicinity of the works, however the intersection will remain open to traffic at all times. Please take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Access for properties will also be maintained and every effort will be made to minimise impacts to surrounding properties and road users, as much as practically possible.

Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to take care when travelling through the area. For safety reasons there may be some restricted access at times. Where this is required, signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access and/or detours.

Individual service providers including Telecommunications providers, APA Gas, SA Power Networks and SA Water will advise separately of any potential interruptions to services during these works.
