

Active Pedestrian Crossing

Jane Street, West Croydon

The State Government is improving safety and accessibility along the rail network by constructing an Activated Pedestrian Crossing at Jane Street, West Croydon.

What's happening

On **Friday 8 November, Saturday 9 and Friday 15 November 2024**, after the last train service and before first train service, we will be installing new rail joints, new light poles and asphaltting.

The work will take place in the rail corridor, using hi-rail machinery, from the level crossing at Queen Street and David Terrace to Jane Street, West Croydon.

How this affects you

You may experience low-level vibration and hear noise from rail equipment, machinery, vehicle movements and essential communication between workers, however every effort will be made to minimise disruption to residents during these works.

The existing Jane Street pedestrian crossing will be closed during the works on **Friday 8 November, Saturday 9 and Friday 15 November 2024** after last train service and before first train service. Pedestrians and cyclists are asked to use the West Croydon Railway Station subway or the pedestrian crossing at Brown and Malcolm Streets as detours during this time.

Temporary lighting towers will be used at night along the works area to ensure safe working conditions for the team, we will ensure the lights are directed towards the work area.
