# Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

## Bells Road temporary closure and detour

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is delivering infrastructure upgrades on the Princes Highway, from Tantanoola to the South Australian/Victorian border. The project forms part of the \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade program, which is jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments (80:20).

As part of the program, the Department is constructing new northbound and southbound overtaking lanes approximately nine kilometres north of Millicent. The works also include road resurfacing, and improved drainage. The upgrades will deliver improved safety and traffic efficiency along the Princes Highway.

#### What to expect

Works will be undertaken Monday to Saturday, between 7am and 5:00pm. Some work outside of these times may be required with advance notice provided. **No works will be undertaken on Sunday.** 

To safely undertake these works Bells Road will be temporarily closed at the junction with Princes Highway from Monday, 24 July 2023 for approximately six weeks (weather permitting), with detours in place via Walkers Tin Hut Road and Main Road 300 (please see detour map overleaf).

Princes Highway will remain open to traffic in both directions for the duration of the works, with speed restrictions in place throughout the work area.

Please plan ahead, allow extra travel time, and take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area. **Outside of working hours** speed restrictions will remain in place subject to onsite conditions and Bells Road will remain closed.

Access for emergency service vehicles will be maintained at all times during the works. Access to properties will be maintained throughout the works wherever possible, with advance notice provided if there is a need to temporarily restrict driveway access.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible. You may also notice some odour which is common when asphalting works are underway. We appreciate your cooperation and patience while these important works are undertaken.
